<b>Languages</b>	Articles submitted in <b>Spanish, Portuguese</b> and <b>English</b> are accepted and will be translated into <b>French</b> .	
<b>Format</b>	Single spaced, letter size (8,5"x 11"), Times New Roman, 12 points.	
<b>Length</b>	<b>1,500 words</b> Including author biographies, notes, references if applicable, tables, figures and images.	
<b>Structure</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>The <b>title</b> includes a maximum of <b>12 words</b>.</li><li><b>Subtitles</b> are recommended throughout the text to clarify the structure and to facilitate the reading.</li><li>Titles and subtitles are written in lower case, bold letters.</li><li>The names of the <b>author(s)</b> must appear below the article's title.</li><li>A brief <b>biography (75 words maximum)</b> of each of the author is included at the end of the text.</li><li><b>Recommended structure:</b> Introduction, argumentation and one or many conclusions.</li></ul>	
<b>Photos and Images</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Please suggest <b>2 or 3 images</b>, in <b>high resolution</b> (300 dpi). They will be published in black and white.</li><li>As <b>attachment</b> in <b>.jpg</b> or <b>.png</b>.</li><li>You must send images that are <b>copyright-free</b> and that you are allowed to publish.</li><li><b>Photo credits</b> must appear below the photo (author, year of publication), as well as a <b>short description</b> (20 words maximum), if necessary.</li></ul>	
<b>Tables and Figures</b>	<b>Tables and figures</b> have their own short titles (inserted at the right location in the text) and are sent as attachment by email in high resolution (.jpg or .png).	

<b>Acronyms</b>	Any institution or organization that uses an acronym must first be written out in full and immediately followed by the acronym in parentheses. <i>Example: Committee for Human Rights in Latin America (CDHAL)</i>	
<b>References</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Notes</b> must appear at the end of the text and must be identified in arabic numerals.</li> <li>• Articles may have up to a <b>maximum of 10 notes</b>, including bibliographical references.</li> <li>• References must be presented as <b>notes at the end of the text</b>. Please refer to the examples below.</li> <li>• Please make sure that all links are properly working.</li> </ul>

<b>Scientific article</b>	Last name, first name (year). "Article title", <i>Journal title</i> , no. X, p. X to X.  Bresser-Pereira, Luiz Carlos (2009). "Amérique latine : de l'interprétation nationaliste à l'interprétation par la dépendance", <i>Tiers-monde</i> , no. 199, p.533-546.
<b>Newspaper article</b>	Last name, first name (year). "Article title", <i>Newspaper title</i> . (If referring to an online article, include the link.)  Larouche, Vincent (2013). "L'ambassade appuie un projet minier douteux au Mexique", <i>La Presse</i> . <a href="http://www.lapresse.ca/actualites/politique-canadienne/201305/05/01-4647840-lambassade-appuie-un-projet-minier-douteux-au-mexique.php">http://www.lapresse.ca/actualites/politique-canadienne/201305/05/01-4647840-lambassade-appuie-un-projet-minier-douteux-au-mexique.php</a> .  If the article is not signed by a particular author, the journal title comes first.

<b>Chapter in collective work</b>	Last name, first name (year). "Chapter title", in Last name, first name (dir.), <i>Book title</i> . City: editor.  Blackwood, Elizabeth and Veronika Stewart (2012). "CIDA and the Mining Sector: Extractive Industries as an Overseas Development Strategy", in Brown, Stephen (dir.), <i>Struggling for Effectiveness: CIDA and Canadian Foreign Aid</i> . Montréal; Ithaca : McGillQueen's University Press.
<b>Thesis, dissertation or other research work</b>	Last name, first name (year). <i>Title</i> , thesis/dissertation. University.  Cournier, Marine (2013). <i>Sociétés minières canadiennes et violations des droits de l'homme à l'étranger : le Canada respecte-t-il les prescriptions internationales en la matière?</i> , Master's thesis. Université de Montréal.
<b>An organization's report or press release</b>	Name of organization (year). <i>Report/press release title</i> . (If referring to an online page, include the link.)  United Steelworkers, Common Frontiers et MiningWatch Canada (2013). <i>Report Reveals How Canadian Diplomacy Supported Deadly Blackfire Mining Project</i> . <a href="http://www.miningwatch.ca/news/report-reveals-how-canadian-diplomacy-supported-deadly-blackfire-mining-project">http://www.miningwatch.ca/news/report-reveals-how-canadian-diplomacy-supported-deadly-blackfire-mining-project</a> .
